## PRESIDENT'S LETTER – AGM REPORT



Dear Ark Members,

First of all, thank you all for taking the time out to join us this afternoon; your presence is much appreciated.

At the 2016 AGM the following Executive Officers were Bob Parravicino – President, Elizabeth Cole – Vice President, Jennifer Pequenezza – Treasurer, Jo Gamblin – Secretary, with Stuart Martin, Dominique Maraj, Isdolde Pottkamper, Donna Murray-Wiltshire, and Anne Martindale Committee members.

This Committee has worked together well both in fundraising and management of the kennels and we have had another challenging and successful year.

### SPAY/NEUTER AND ADOPTIONS PROGRAM -

This year we can report that **117 dogs and 93 cats were spayed/neutered**. Much of this has been accomplished with the assistance of K9 Friends of Barbados who finance the spaying of female dogs through approved vets. The RSPCA has also continued to provide us with 3 free spay/neuter operations each month. We are very grateful to both of these organizations for their continued support. **During 2016, 156 dogs and 9 cats were adopted through the Ark.** Dominique Maraj has worked tirelessly with both of these programs and we cannot thank her enough for the time she has given to try to ensure that the dogs leaving our shelter are placed in homes that can provide a happy life for them.

Special mention should be made here of the role that K9 Friends of Barbados plays in our operations. We have established close ties with K9 Friends and they have been kind enough to pay for the Ark's food bill for our rescues, as well as part of the spay/neuter program, as previously noted.

### FUNDRAISING -

As costs of operating our shelter continue to rise, the Committee has had to work harder to raise sufficient funds to meet these expenses. Our monthly book sales continue to be popular and are a major contributor to our funding. Thanks to all the ladies who give of their time to transport and sell the books which are donated.

This year we had two yard sales, one in July at Liz Senior's house and the other hosted at Jennifer Pequenezza's house at Rendezvous. These sales are now well established and we have many repeat customers. The next sale should be held in June or July at Liz Senior's house in Strathclyde. The Ark also participated at a flea market at Providence school which was moderately successful.

With the support of Billy and his team we continue to sell books at Art Splash Cafe and this year we took in \$1275.35.

In 2016, 750 calendars were printed for 2017 and we're happy to report that there are very few remaining for sale. We were extremely fortunate to have had the cost of the printing of these calendars paid for by an anonymous benefactor so the profit will obviously be more than usual as the sponsorship donations were converted into advertising space.

All of the 26 collections boxes made by Donna Murray-Wiltshire are in place on both coasts and continue to contribute to the coffers of the Ark. The large 'bullet' which was located at Massy Store in Holetown has had to be removed and is temporarily located at the shelter. This container is very cumbersome to move around and difficult to empty so we are looking at finding a replacement to put back in Holetown. Management at Massy Supermarket says that they would be happy to have something more attractive.

Donations Take Many Forms ...

We are frequently touched by the generosity of our supporters and from time to time are surprised by the form that donations take. One of the more unusual ones came from Trevor Byrne in Canada in December 2016. He contacted us to ask if we could use 2896 unused \$1.15 Barbados postage stamps. The stamps were left over from a Direct Mail campaign he had undertaken and Trevor wondered whether we could use them or sell them to raise funds for the charity. We were delighted to accept his offer and received the stamps later that month.

So what did we do with them? The General Post Office was not able to exchange the stamps for us so we approached The Veterinary Clinic and The Central Veterinary Clinic. We offered them the stamps at the price of a local postal stamp i.e. \$0.65. They both accepted with one giving us a cheque and the other crediting our account to the value of the stamps bought.

We still have a small number of stamps left - probably enough to cover the cost of posting newsletters to Ark members who are not on email for the rest of this year. So those Members who receive their newsletter by post now know where the postage has come from! We are grateful to Trevor for thinking of us and for his generous donation.

Another unusual donation came from one of our Trustees, Brian Barnes, who offered his ocean view apartment at The Crane Hotel for rent at a very reduced rate. Someone has taken Brian up on his offer and the rent will be donated to The Ark's land acquisition fund.

Donations don't always have to be financial. There are many people who donate their time and make an invaluable contribution towards the smooth running of the shelter and the wellbeing of our dogs. Amanda Ramsay and her team from Ruff Cutts Dog Grooming Services (pictured right –Amanda, Crystal, Marlon & Romario) recently donated their time one Saturday to give our dogs their very own "Spa Day". It was a full day's work as the team bathed and groomed over 42 dogs. Professional grooming is not something The Ark has funds for so it was a lovely treat for our dogs who looked and smelt wonderful when they returned to their kennels at the end of the day.

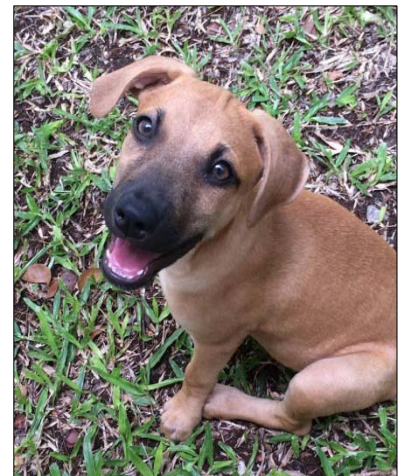

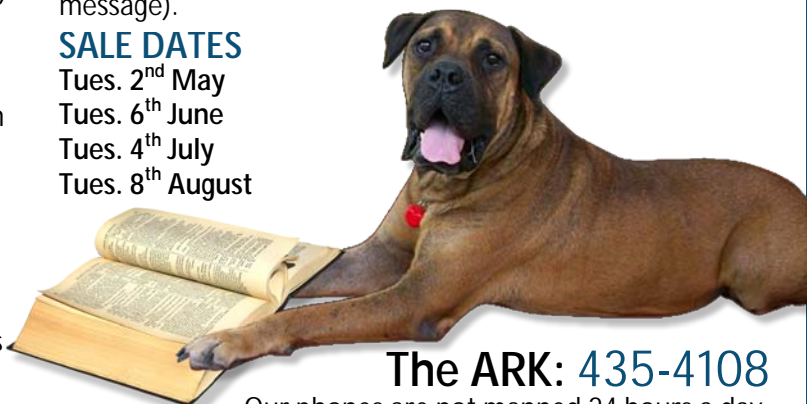
### Monthly Book Sale
